



## GUIDELINES: PERSPECTIVES

A PERSPECTIVE is expected to provide an intentional point of view on the topic of interest, and lends itself to strong opinion; perspectives will be invited specially to address major developments in a field that change how we see the past and color how we approach future investigations.

Perspectives should include:

- 100-word abstract.
- 1500 word text (maximum), excluding references.
- Headings may be added at your discretion.
- Include a conflict of interest statement.
- 2 figures (at the Editor's discretion, after acceptance, *JID's* medical illustrator may assist you in redrawing key illustrations in a standard format).
- References in *JID* style (alphabetical, with inclusive pages; 6 authors plus et al – for one author, callout in the text should appear as "(Smith, 2012)"; for two authors "(Smith & Jones, 2012)"; for three or more authors "(Smith et al, 2012)".
- Perspectives articles should not have supplementary data (but multimedia files are allowed).
- Submit the article using the link supplied by the Editorial Office.
- All articles are peer reviewed prior to acceptance and publication, and some invited articles may ultimately not be accepted for publication.
- *Note: There are no page charges or submission fees for invited articles; however, page charges apply for author-initiated Perspectives articles.*
