PUBLICATION CHECKLIST

Please carefully note the publication requirements below. This material should be received within 2 weeks; any delay will result in a delay in the publication of your article.

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Title Page

- Include full author names and affiliations.
- Include corresponding author contact information (phone number, address, and email).
- The corresponding author may provide a Twitter handle.

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- Provide a single Word (.doc) file containing text (and tables).
- Original Articles** should be organized as follows: Title Page, Abstract, Introduction, Results, Discussion, Materials and Methods, Data Availability Statement, Conflict of Interest Statement, Acknowledgments, CRediT Statement (author contributions), References, Tables, Figure Legends.
- Letters to the Editor** should be organized as follows: Title Page, Letter Text, Data Availability Statement, Conflict of Interest Statement, Acknowledgments, CRediT Statement (author contributions), References, Tables, Figure Legends.
- Remove any underlines or tracked changes.
- Write out acronyms on first use.
- JID* style prohibits claims of novelty (i.e. “new,” “novel” or “the first”). Please update your text accordingly.

Materials & Methods Section

- For animal studies, include a statement of institutional approvals (e.g., "The medical ethical committee of *institution name* approved all described studies.>").
- For studies involving human subjects, include a statement confirming the following:
 - Institutional approval
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Ex: "Patient consent for experiments was not required because French laws consider human tissue left over from surgery as discarded material."
- If the submission contains a patient photograph, include a statement in the Materials and Methods section and in the figure legend indicating that the patient gave permission to publish the image.
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Data Availability Statement

- For submissions containing original research, describe the availability of the minimal dataset that would be necessary to interpret, replicate and build upon the current submission. For more detail, see the "Data Availability Policy" in our Instructions for Authors.

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- List any financial, equity, patenting, or other relevant relationships or arrangements with a product or sponsor of research that might constitute a conflict of interest. If the authors have no conflict of interest to declare, this should be noted using the standard phrase, "The authors state no conflict of interest."

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 - *Project Administration*: Management and coordination responsibility for the research activity planning and execution.
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- *JID* uses *Vancouver, Name & Year* style. Present references in an alphabetical list, use inclusive and truncated page numbers, and list up to six authors (if more, list the first six and add et al). Present callouts in the text as "Smith, 2009", "Smith & Jones, 2009", or "Smith et al, 2009."

Figure Titles and Legends

- A brief title is required for each figure. Figure titles should briefly describe (100 characters) the figure as a whole, without reference to individual parts (i.e., panel a, b, etc.). While individual parts of a figure should be labeled with letters (a, b, c, etc.) sub-labels (i.e., i, ii, iii, etc.) are never permitted.
- Provide a brief legend for each figure following the figure title.

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- Tables should be editable within the .doc or .docx file.
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- Tables longer than one page should be presented as supplementary material.

FIGURES

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- There is no additional charge for color.
- If using black-and-white, use three solid colors - white, gray, and black, and patterns (dots, checks, etc.) for additional data.
- Avoid background shading.
- Use three-dimensional graphs ONLY to express three-dimensional data.

Western Blots

- JID* Editorial policy requires that few or no alterations be made to blots. Figures should show an accurate representation that does not obscure or eliminate any information present in the original.
- The grouping of images from different parts of the same gel, or from different gels, must be made explicit by the appearance of white space or a solid line between the spliced lanes.
