



GUIDELINES: COMMENTARIES

- Your remit is to place the *JID* topic article in context. The topic article must be prominently mentioned in the first paragraph of the text.
- Co-authors are welcome.
- Provide a 300 .dpi photograph of each author for publication, if 1 or 2 authors (no photographs if more than 2 authors); name each image file with the author's last name.
- Provide a TITLE for the Commentary.
- Text should be 1-2 journal pages in length (1000-2000 words).
- Subheadings are encouraged.
- A figure showing the mechanisms described in the topic paper is especially encouraged.
- As appropriate, include a clinical photograph representative of the pathophysiology or treatment of the condition or finding discussed.
- Provide a title (required) and legend (optional) for each figure.
- Include three very brief (12 words or fewer) bullet points concerning clinical and/or basic research relevance -- OR a "pullquote" (one brief sentence highlighting a crucial point in the commentary).
- Include a conflict of interest statement.
- Use no more than 10 references.
- Use *JID* reference style (alphabetical/inclusive page numbers; see the Information for Authors at www.jidonline.org for details).
- The topic article MUST be included in the references (provide as much information as you have; volume and page range will be added at the time of proofs).
- All articles are peer reviewed prior to acceptance and publication, and some invited articles may ultimately not be accepted for publication.
- There are no publication charges for invited commentaries.
