



REVIEW ARTICLE GUIDELINES

A REVIEW ARTICLE is expected to be comprehensive, scholarly, and balanced, presenting an expert curation of the literature in the topic of interest. *JID Innovations* is especially interested in reviews which highlight current gaps or controversies in the subject under review. In addition, reviews should be forward looking, suggesting new areas of investigation or new approaches to closing knowledge gaps in the topic under review. Authors are encouraged to contact the Editor before submitting reviews for consideration. Proposals should include the full author list and authors' affiliations, an abstract, and a list of the authors' relevant publications. Proposals may be sent to Jan.Higgins@sidnet.org.

- Text should be 3000 words, excluding references.
- Include a 100-word abstract.
- Include a conflict of interest statement.
- References Use *JID Journals* reference style (alphabetical, with inclusive pages; 6 authors plus et al – for one author, callout in the text should appear as “(Smith, 2012)”; for two authors “(Smith & Jones, 2012)”; for three or more authors “(Smith et al, 2012)”.
- Review articles should not have supplementary data (but multimedia files are allowed).
- Submit the article using the link provided.
- All articles are peer reviewed prior to acceptance and publication, and some invited articles may ultimately not be accepted for publication
- *Note: Publication charges apply to author-initiated (unsolicited) review articles.*
